Employment survey and career advancement in 2010

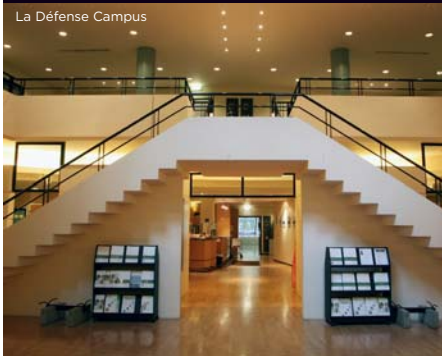
The survey was carried out between January and April 2011 for the class of 2010 of which 53% responded to the survey.

The highlight is the **rise of Asia** as the first workplace to the detriment of United States and the marked increase in functions connected to international activities

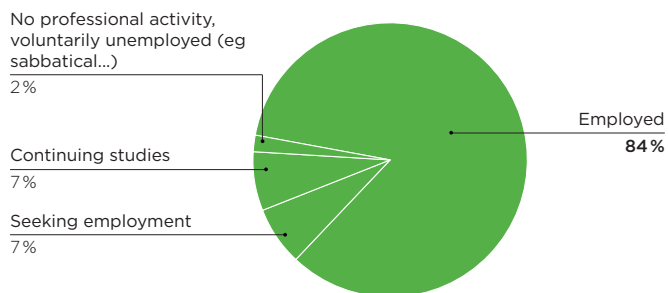
The class of 2010 is made up of:

- 52.7% female; 47.3% male.
- Students of foreign nationalities represented 12% of the promotion.
- Upon graduation, students had acquired an average of 19.3 months of work experience and 8.5 months of international experience.

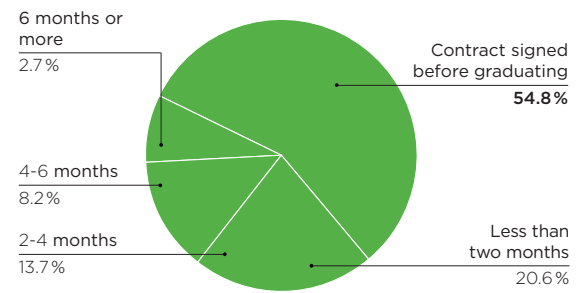




84% of the graduates are currently employed

➤ 77% of graduates chose their jobs based on the interest of the mission and its relevance to their career plans.



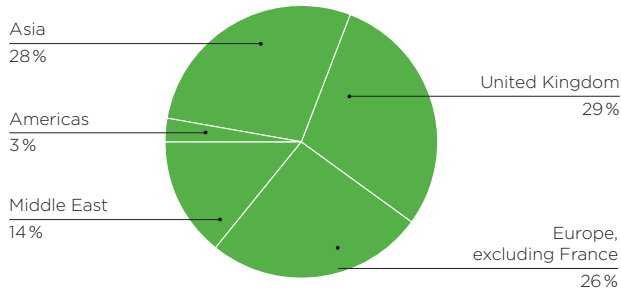
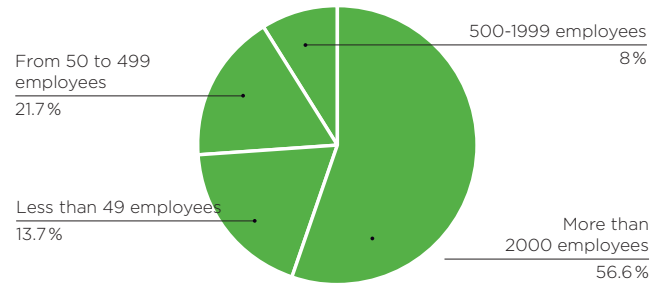
